Student Writing Contest for Grades K-12

Message to Teachers & Principals:

KASA's upcoming conference, July 18-20, 2007, marks the 38th anniversary of the Association. To celebrate this event, the conference committee will host its sixth annual writing contest for students in grades K-12. This year's contest, titled Extreme Inspiration, Passion & Commitment encourages students to write about a teacher, administrator or an adult mentor or role model in a public school who has inspired them beyond the ordinary to believe in themselves and achieve at higher levels than they thought possible on their own.

The contest has been designed to complement writing portfolios—giving students an authentic audience and purpose for writing.

The goal of the contest is to recognize student excellence and to honor some of Kentucky's outstanding educators. (*Note: Contest guidelines are listed on page two.*)

We hope you and your students will participate in the contest, and we encourage you to share any feedback that would improve the overall process. A student message and contest guidelines follow.

Message to Students:

As you work toward the goals you have set at school and in life, who has inspired you to go beyond the ordinary to achieve at higher levels? Who has motivated you to overcome barriers and meet the challenges you face each day? Who has been passionately committed to your educational growth and development? Who has encouraged you to be somebody special?

Through the format of your choice, please WRITE about this special SCHOOL person in your life. The individual may be a teacher, a support staff person (e.g., instructional assistant, bus driver, etc.), or a principal. The person you choose to write about must be an adult who has worked with you at your current school or a previous school you attended.

In your writing, please identify the relationship you share with this special school person and how he or she has helped you be successful. (*Note: Contest guidelines are listed on page two.*)

Please submit your contest entry to your teacher or principal. **Do not mail it to the KASA office.**

Student Writing Contest for Grades K-12, *Continued*

Criteria & Contest Guidelines

1. All entries must be handwritten or typed and submitted on an 8 ½" x 11" size sheet of paper.
2. Typed entries must be single spaced with a minimum 12-point font size.
3. Length: Grades K-5 one-page maximum / Grades 6-12 two-page maximum.
4. Students select appropriate format for writing purpose (e.g., memoir, personal narrative, persuasive piece, etc.).
5. Content should focus on a classified or certified staff member in a Kentucky school, presently working or retired, who has had a positive influence on the student's academic success. Content should clearly identify the relationship of the student and his/her role model and how that role model relates to the student's educational success.
6. Each school may submit **one (1)** essay from grades K-2, 3-5, 6-8, or 9-12.
7. The following identification information must be written or typed in the upper right-hand corner of the entry: student's name, school name, grade level, and principal's name.
8. School's final contest entry should be submitted to KASA by the school principal with a cover sheet or brief note endorsing the contest entry. (School Entry Form Follows)
9. School's final contest entry must be received at the KASA office no later than April 16, 2007. Faxes and emails cannot be accepted. Please allow five business days for mailing.
10. Entries will be scored holistically based on Kentucky's Writing Scoring Guide.
11. Contest winners will be announced in early May prior to year-end school celebrations.

Note: Entries not submitted in accordance with the above guidelines will be disqualified.

Entries must be received at the KASA office by **April 16, 2007.**

Recognition:

First, second and third place winners will be recognized from each of the four grade level categories—K-2; 3-5; 6-8; 9-12.

- A. First place winners will be recognized as follows:
 - Invited (along with special school person) to read their winning entry at KASA's annual conference, July 18-20, 2007;
 - Presented a \$100 gift certificate provided by A+ Auto & Home Insurance Company;
 - Overnight accommodations at the Galt House Hotel or mileage reimbursement in accordance with KASA's approved rate for travel to and from the conference. Overnight accommodations require parental attendance. **Note: Mileage reimbursement applies to winning student's parent driver.*
- B. Second and third place winners will receive a certificate of excellence and be recognized at their school's year-end recognition ceremony.
- C. Special school persons (first place entries) attending the conference with his/her student will be recognized, receive a gift certificate, overnight lodging at the Galt House, and reimbursement for travel to and from the conference. –*Sponsored by the Kentucky Army National Guard.*
